MATHS

KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING

LITERACY

The children received a letter from some 'Bad Guys' explaining that they had kidnapped our friends Golden Bear and Cookie Monster! The children were outraged and were desperate to rescue them. So we read the story 'Elliot the Midnight Superhero' to give us some ideas. The children learnt to retell the story and then drew story maps to show how they would adapt the story to how they would rescue Cookie Monster and Golden Bear. The children had some super ideas of how they might turn in to Midnight Superheroes themselves and fly over to rescue their friends or build a trap to catch the 'Bad Guys'. Later, we role played their ideas and built a real trap by digging a huge hole in the Woodland area and disguising it with sticks and leaves! We were so excited when our plan worked and we caught the Bad Guys in the trap! Once we had rescued our friends, we were able to write our own fantastic superhero adventure using the same structure as the story we had read. We are all fantastic authors now!

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE

The children have been learning all about the farm following our trip to Manor Farm. The children listened to the story 'Farmer Duck' and explored what the characters would be saying throughout the book. The children had some super ideas about how the poor duck would be feeling and what he might say to his friends. We have extended our learning about animals to exploring where different animals live. We listened to each other's ideas of what we already knew and asked questions to help us find out about new information.

PERSONAL SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

During our 'Plastic ocean' adventure theme week, the children learnt all about the impact that plastic waste is having on the creatures that live in the sea. The children were brilliant at thinking how the animals would be feeling and wrote speech bubbles from the sea creatures as if they could really talk to us. We found that plastic had also blown into our pond and discussed how dangerous this would be for our brand new baby duckling. During this week we collected plastic from our homes and worked collaboratively as a class to create a sea creature made from empty plastic containers.

MATHS

During maths this term we have been learning how to count in different ways, we know how to count in tens, twos and fives now and we are starting to know when to use these different ways of counting. We have learnt how to add and take away and now we know lots of different methods to help us do this. We were able to decide which method to use when solving add or take away Superhero problems, and we can even record this as a number sentence.

KNOWLEDGE AND UNDERSTANDING

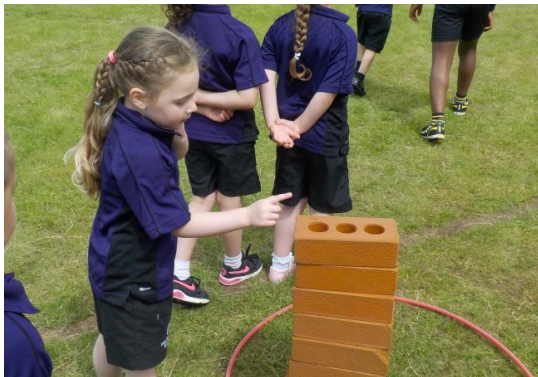
We loved our trip to Manor Farm, where we were able to see and touch lots of different kinds of animals. We were able to hold and feed some little animal; our favourites were the spiky hedgehog, the soft fluffy rabbits and the very noisy parrot. We even got to see a beautiful white horse and some very cute llamas.

This term we have also enjoyed learning about the Royal Wedding, where we role played our own Wedding with Shakil and Sienna taking the role as the Royal couple. We were lucky enough to have a real Vicar in school to help us perform the wedding and we invited all our Mums and Dads to watch too. Afterwards we even had a piece of a delicious wedding cake that was made by one of our mums in school. This helped us learn about weddings and celebrations in different cultures and gave us the chance to talk about our own experiences of attending a wedding.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Sports day was a great chance for us to show off all the skills we have learnt during the year in PE sessions. We have learnt how to throw and catch a ball and how to kick a ball successfully. We have learnt how to play team games involving collecting and sorting objects. We are all brilliant on an obstacle course and are able to balance and travel in different ways.

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Year 1

Literacy

The three little pigs story allowed us to investigate our science theme of materials through our literacy work. We immersed ourselves in the story by creating story maps, shows and writing about characters. We developed our science vocabulary as well as our literacy skills, by rewriting the story and writing letters and reports for the pigs about the best sort of materials to use. After half term we went to 'Where the wild things are' and through drama, vocabulary work, potion making and character descriptions we built up our skills and knowledge enough to write our own wonderful wild thing stories.

Maths

We have taken our maths outside using the playground to solve multiplication and division problems. We have developed our measuring skills by measuring ourselves and how far we can throw and jump. We have used natural materials to help us solve word problems as well as creating large shapes. We have also worked on addition, subtraction, fractions and time.

Topic

Summer term began with our materials topic. we investigated ways to fix golden bears umbrella, found out which material was the strongest, most waterproof or most suitable for its job. This lead nicely into our theme on plastic pollution. Year 1 really embraced the idea that we can all make a difference. The children showed really mature understanding.

We also managed to fit in the life cycle of a caterpillar and continued our work on plants and growing. To finish the term, we have focused upon our amazing bodies. we have learnt about the different key parts including the heart, lungs and brain and focused upon how we can take care of ourselves too.

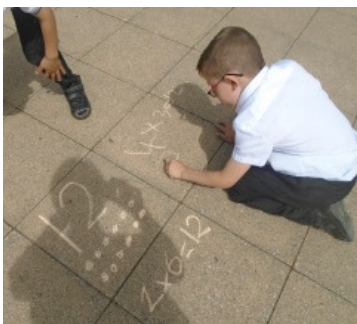

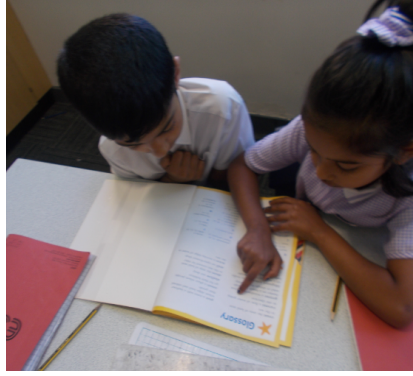
Goodbye Year 1

Year 2



Literacy

Year 2 have done some lovely writing this term. They created their own Healthy Fruit Salad during our 'Fit For Life Week' and wrote their own instructions for it. They used ordering openers, adverbs and top tips. We have also been reading Roald Dahl's Fantastic Mr Fox in preparation for Year 3 where the children will be doing some work on this in the first few weeks. We have written descriptions of the characters and created their own feast in the Foxes burrow.

Maths

This term we have revised the methods of the four operations and looked at how to tell the time and what different amounts of money add up to. We have done a lot of outdoor maths to inspire learning and word problems to challenge their understanding and get them excited. This has gone really well.

Topic

Year 2 have learnt about Seaside Towns this year and what it was like at a seaside town now compared to many years ago. We have developed our vocabulary and Year 2 have used this language in different contexts. We have visited Colwick Woods to create dens and look at mini beasts and created tally charts in the Wild. We also had our exciting trip to Greens Windmill where we learnt how flour is made and explored the Science Centre.

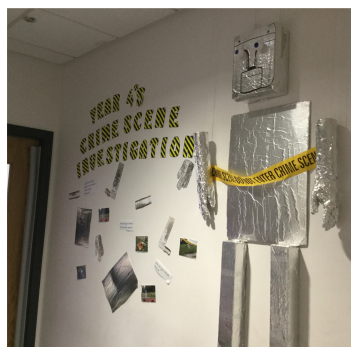
Goodbye Year 3

Year 4



LITERACY

We've had great fun this term in literacy by writing our very own Roman myths with a main character who faces a problem that needs to be solved. We included lots of speech and we are now very good at using inverted commas. Our main focus for this half term has been The Iron Man, which is a brilliant story. We started with a crime scene, which was great fun trying to piece together the clues and work out what had happened. We then wrote our own story based on the Iron Man and we create our own characters in the same style such as The Wood Woman or Mental Man.

MATHS

We've focused on the four operations this term and we were able to choose strategies that we felt confident to use. We then applied these skills to help us solve a range of problems. We have learnt about fractions, which was fun because we got to use real cakes and cut them into halves and quarters before eating them! We also used Numicon to help us find equivalent fractions, which we really enjoyed because it was a fun practical task.

TOPIC

Our main theme this term was The Romans. We learned about the pros and cons of being a Roman soldier and had great fun exploring some Roman weapons and armour and trying to work out what they were used for. We also made our very own Roman shields.

We had a great time during the Plastic Pollution theme week. We all really engaged with the topic by working in teams to make brilliant games using recycled plastic. We then pitched our ideas to the teachers in a Dragon's Den style presentation called Oceans Den, which was great fun!

The children had the opportunity to showcase their amazing talents in singing, acting and performing to an audience for our Eid assembly. The children rehearsed really hard with great dedication to learning their lines, dance routines and practising all the songs. It was a marvelous celebration where everyone could smile and sing along and parents were left feeling thrilled with an understanding of what Eid means to the Muslim community.

Year 5

LITERACY

We have loved reading 'The Haunted Piccolo' by Gene Kemp this term, with most of our Guided Reading reflecting our predicting and inference skills around this spooky story. In order to prepare ourselves for Roald Dahl Week next year, we took a sneaky peak at 'The Witches' by Roald Dahl by writing character descriptions of the gruesome, toe-curling, pungent Grand High Witch – we showed off with our use of similes, metaphors, personification and repetition for effect.

We have also had the chance to create our own Greek Myths linked to our Ancient Greece topic as well as write about our own lives this term, through creating our own autobiographies. Some of us challenged ourselves further to write a biography on someone who inspires us.

MATHS

This term we have revised the formal, written methods for the 4 operations, as well as focused on relationships between fractions, decimals and percentages. We have enjoyed the exciting, new opportunities we have faced through the challenges set and by taking our learning outside. We have applied our knowledge and methods to new and complex problems, leaving many of us to rely on our problem solving and deeper thinking skills.

We even took advantage of the World Cup by basing our maths our football problems and scoring goals when we completed the problem correctly – it was so much fun!

TOPIC

Learning about the Ancient Greeks this term as well as the religion of Islam has provided us with a number of opportunities to discover other cultures and direct our own learning. We have excelled at having choices about what we learn and have produced some stunning work surrounding these topics. We turned into artists and created a number of pieces of artwork such as: Greek pots made out of clay, sketches of Medusa and Islamic tile art.

Year 6

LITERACY

This term, we have written a range of genres to prepare the children for their transition to secondary. The children have written letters of complaint where they had to apply ordering and consequence conjunctions, as well as give detailed reasons for their complaint

They have also completed a unit of work based around the book, Kensuke's Kingdom, which tells the story of a boy marooned on an island with his dog. The children loved writing missing person posters, diary entries and debating whether Michael's Dad was right to set sail around the world and take him out of school. This scheme of work fitted in nicely with our whole school theme of Drama in the Wild, as we were able to do conscience alleys, debates and a Newsround-inspired drama explaining that Michael had been found.

MATHS

At the start of this term, the children participated in revision sessions in the lead up to SAT's in May where they were able to review a range of topics in preparation for national testing. After SAT's, the children learnt all about algebra and had to work out the value of different shapes in an equation. They absolutely loved doing this, as it enabled them to apply a range of key skills: creative thinking, resilience, team work, determination, application of number and communication. We have also continued to work on the children's calculation skills and discussed whether a sum can be done mentally, or whether a written calculation is needed.

TOPIC

During Topic, we have been learning about evolution and inheritance. We discussed what these terms mean and conducted research into Charles Darwin.

KINGSWOOD

In the summer term, Year 6 attended a residential at Kingswood, Dearne Valley. They spent three days taking part in various activities: lasertag, zipwire, disco, archery and a campfire. Kingswood is the highlight of the year for the children in Year 6 and is a chance to celebrate all of their hard work.

Music News

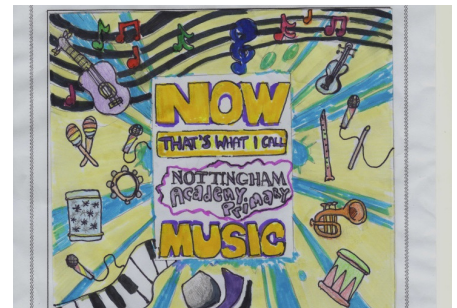

We are a group of young entrepreneurs from Year 2 and we have met weekly to organise every detail from marketing to auditions to the final show!

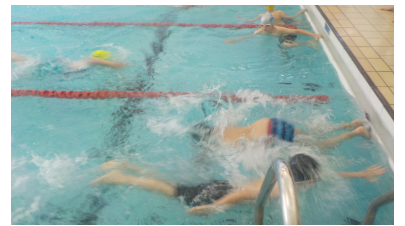
